Rosie was born to a loving church family in the middle of Colorado. Life was hard but filled with promise and simple joys. She was Valedictorian of her high school class and pursued by various young men, one of whom, no kidding, was named Ford Fairlane. She left all that behind and headed to California to pursue and achieve her dream of becoming a nurse. In the midst of that she met a man, was married and gave birth to a daughter, the apple of her eye. That same apple caught my eye 20 years later.

For most of us there comes a point in our lives when we realize that fairy tales are only in storybooks. That happened for Rosie shortly after her daughter was born. The man she gave herself to, turned out to be abusive and when threat came to her little one, she left him and raised that child on her own. Her nursing career was fulfilling and paid the bills for a while, until mysterious symptoms made continuing in the nursing field impossible. The diagnosis, when it was finally made, was MS, a disease that damages the central nervous system. This disease was progressive and the last 20 years of her life were spent in a wheelchair. With no husband, no job and a crippling disease Rosie did the best she could for herself and her daughter. Then I came along. I hope I brought a little joy to my mother-in-law, even though I always teased that I was going to sing at her funeral a little song from The Wizard Of Oz that rejoices, "Ding Dong"

I don't tell this to gain sympathy for Rosie, she never needed it. I tell this because some of you might be living years of desperation right now. You, or someone you love, might be watching plans and dreams crumble even as I write this article.

So, what does a person do in desperate circumstances like this? All I can offer is what I witnessed in Rosie. She had an unshakeable faith in the God of heaven. She knew that sometimes this life stinks, but her hope was on a life to come. Her prayers and her songs of faith could be heard by my family each evening drifting up our stairs. The words, "Why me?", never crossed her lips in my hearing.

Hebrews 10:34b-36 (NLT) was not her favorite verse, but it sure is one that tells the story of her life. "...when all you owned was taken from you, you accepted it with joy. You knew there were better things waiting for you that will last forever. So do not throw away this confident trust in the Lord. Remember the great reward it brings you! Patient endurance is what you need now, so that you will continue to do God's will. Then you will receive all that he has promised."


